Wayne initiated two things: Our meetings will be the first Tuesday of the month, effective with the January meeting (January 3, 2012), and there will be a planning meeting Sunday evening, January 8, 2012, 5 pm. All chairpersons of committees are asked to participate and any other church members who would like to attend are welcome. After reviewing the minutes, a motion (Dave/Bud) carried to accept the November minutes as printed.	 Family Ministries – Thanks to Judy Belcher and Karen Ekstrom for organizing the play and family dinner on Sunday, December 11. Sunday, December 18th, will be Christmas Caroling at 6:30 pm, followed by hot chocolate and cookies in the multipurpose room at the church. Plans are to carol in the close neighborhood and perhaps drive to a couple of houses and then return for hot chocolate/cookies. Outreach - We have received 15 names from the St. Albans Ministerial Association of families designated to receive Christmas Baskets. These have been assigned to Lakeview families and turkeys/hams are being purchased with funds that are given for this outreach venture. Any extra funds will be given to Christ's Kitchen. The Worship Committee is supplying New Testaments to be included with the baskets.
 Treasurer's Report – We did not make an Apportionment payment in November, but additional funds have been received and our expectation is that we will be able to meet this obligation.
