Motion (Bud/Karen K.) to accept the December minutes as printed.

Treasurer's Report – Treasurer's report was accepted as printed (Bud/Robin). We are blessed to finish out our year with our Conference Apportionment and all current bills paid in full. Ron thanked Jeff & Karen for the good job they did handling the church finances for the year.

Finance – The committee met and agreed to work as a committee to handle memorial funds that are given to the church.

Discussion took place regarding being able to pay off our building fund loan by the time of our 50th year celebration. Perhaps using the entire income from our yard sale toward this payment. There was also discussion regarding using some of the memorial money to pay for funding our 50th Anniversary Celebration. Because it was not unanimous, Dave Ashley made a motion to table this until the next meeting.

Motion (Dave K. /Dave A.) carried to send the leftover monies from the Christmas Baskets to the St. Albans Food Pantry.

Fiftieth Anniversary Celebration - The committee met and picked October 21-22-23, 2011 as the weekend for our Celebration.
