



ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL

The meeting was called to order by Wayne Kersey and opened with prayer. Those present in addition to Wayne were Karen Kersey, Bud Newbrough, Linda Thompson, Karen Ekstrom, Dave Koontz, Ron & Marilyn Colby and Don & Marilyn Morton. Motion (Bud/Don) carried to accept the December minutes as printed.

Treasurer's Report - The treasurer's report for December 2012 was distributed, and motion (Don/Dave) carried to accept the report. It was noted that Lakeview made their full Apportionment payment for the 2012 year. We have to date received pledges for \$6,200 per month for 2013.

Finance – Plans are for the Council to handle the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper. This will be held Tuesday, February 12 at the church, and we will serve pancakes, sausage and apples free to church people and the community.

Council moved to set Saturday, April 13 as the date for our Spring Yard Sale. This will allow us to start bringing items to the church the Monday following Easter.

We have an auction Sunday, January 15th at the church to raise money for use of those working with the St Albans/Nitro Shelter Project. There will be a potluck dinner prior to the auction.

One other item discussed was 'snack packs for schools' – which is an outreach some churches in the area are participating in – however, after discussion it was decided that this warranted more discussion before a commitment should be made.

Trustees – The committee met following church on Sunday, and elected Dave Koontz, chairperson and divided up responsibilities for the year.

A carbon monoxide detector has been purchased and will be installed in the parsonage.

Worship – Special thanks to the workers who helped decorate the church for the Christmas season, and take down and store the items following the season.

Next meeting is scheduled for January 16, 6 pm to plan for the Lent/Easter season.

Outreach – We appreciate the church providing 20 Christmas baskets, as well as money for turkeys and hams to be used in these baskets.

There will be two *SOUPER BOWL SUNDAYS* – January 27 and February 3. We will collect canned food which will be given to the shelters.

Nurture - If people know of needs that need to be addressed with our church family, please let the committee know.

Family Ministries – The committee had a *digital meeting* and is working on several projects for the year.

(1) Linda Martin will help organize – Coffee & Company.

(starting Monday, January 21, 8:30 am, interested adults will meet at the church for coffee and conversation.....this will be strictly a social time to connect with our members and friends.....plans are to try this for four weeks and then decide if and how to continue).

- (2) Family Game Night Judy Belcher will plan a game night (with Pizza) probably Sunday, January 27.
- (3) Volleyball Night Karen Ekstrom & Tara Lane will organize *Volleyball* a time when elementary kids & older, plus adults can play Volleyball. (Of course, there will be a small change in rules!)
- (4) Karen Wilson, Pat Moss and Karen Kersey will have activities for the preschoolers during the volleyball games.

Miscellaneous - To close the meeting there was discussion as to how we handle children's church, nursery schedules, etc. Because no one is specifically assigned this responsibility, sometimes these jobs fall to whoever will do it. Consensus by the group was that these important things need to be handled intentionally and not just by default. It was suggested that this be referred back to the Lay Leadership Committee and Wayne agreed to handle this with Pastor Richie.
