

A recommendation from the Administrative Board meeting to think about

At the January Board meeting the suggestion was made and discussed concerning the condition of the steel folding chairs we have in storage and are used by the congregation when we have dinners, etc.

The church owns more than 200 steel folding chairs; most stored in the closet, and some used in the Choir warm-up room and the classroom. Most of these chairs are original chairs which were used 50 years ago in the sanctuary for church services and carried over to the multipurpose room when needed for events there. Quite a few are showing their age, chipped paint, bent legs, etc. They are also not particularly comfortable for sitting any length of time.

The Board is not considering using funds needed for the operation of the church and salaries because that money is what is pledged and donated by our members for that purpose. There are some monies that have been given to the church as memorials or bequests which are not designated for any specific purpose. It has been suggested that some of these funds might be used to purchase a few new chairs that would be much more comfortable (padded seats and backs, for example). Chair storage is a big problem, as everyone knows who has ever looked into the room we use for storage of our tables, chairs and platform. The best solution several of us thought about is try to dispose of some of the steel folding chairs that are in the poorest condition and replace them with a number of the more comfortable chairs. The kind we are thinking about is stackable and do not take up as much storage room as the steel chairs. They are moved about on a roller based dolly that makes them easy to move around and store. We are open to suggestions from the congregation about this proposal and will investigate prices, etc. We are in no rush to do anything. If you have an idea, please let me know and I will pass it along to the Board who will make the final decision.

ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL

The meeting was called to order by Wayne Kersey and opened with prayer. Those present in addition to Wayne were Jeff Ekstrom, Dave Koontz, Don Wilson, Pastor Richie, Linda Martin, Ron & Marilyn Colby and Don & Marilyn Morton. Motion (Ron/Don W.) carried to accept the December minutes as printed.

Treasurer's Report - The treasurer's report for December 2013 was distributed, and motion (Don W./Don M.) carried to accept the report. It was noted that Lakeview made their full Apportionment payment for the 2013 year.

There was a surplus collected for the Christmas food baskets – a total of \$155.50 is left in the fund. Motion (Jeff/Dave) carried to give this money to Linda/Kathi to be used for their work at the shelter in St. Albans.

Trustees – The committee met following church on Sunday, and elected Dave Koontz, chairperson and divided up responsibilities for the year. All areas are covered.

Dick Thompson/Jim Rose plan to modify the furnace controls in the education wing to further lower the monthly gas bills. Also, we ask that if a person has something scheduled at the church facility that it be written on the calendar so that we can make our custodian aware of this to fit his cleaning schedule, and also to let Dick Thompson know about it so that the thermostat can be changed if needed.

Thanks were expressed to the committee for keeping our facility in good repair.

Parsonage – The committee will schedule a meeting with the pastor/wife to make sure we are meeting our responsibilities.

Children's Ministries - A schedule of people to help with teaching our youth has been distributed. We have to staff the nursery, children's Sunday School class and the Tween's Group. Karen Bowyer makes calls to remind people of their turns and if you can't be there on your Sunday to take your turn, please trade with someone to make sure all classes are covered.

Worship - We had a wonderful Advent Season at Lakeview. Special thanks to the workers who helped decorate the church for the Christmas season.

Next meeting will be scheduled in February to plan for the Lent/Easter season.

Outreach – We appreciate the church providing 19 Christmas baskets, as well as money for turkeys and hams to be used in these baskets. Also, some of the canned goods from the St Albans Festival of the Light Tours were taken to Jericho House and the Men's Shelter.

Family Ministries – Dave & Barbara Koontz have volunteered to start the Monday morning Coffee/Conversation hour starting on Monday, January 13.

Pastor's Report – Lakeview's Charge Conference went well, and Lakeview was one of the few churches that paid 100% of their apportionment for 2013.

The Thanksgiving Dinner was very well attended including 16 persons from the Homeless Shelter in town.

Our Children's Christmas program was fun, light hearted – certainly a blessing for Lakeview.

The Christmas Cantata was a highlight of our Christmas Services.

The Christmas Eve Service was well attended with feedback indicating it was meaningful to those in attendance.

Miscellaneous - Motion (Ron/Jeff) carried for Lakeview to sponsor a Shrove Tuesday free pancake supper, March 4th. Bud Newbrough will organize this, and Lakeview's cost is approx... \$120.

We have money being held in designated funds and Marilyn Morton proposed that this be used to purchase chairs to replace the damaged or worn out chairs in the multipurpose room. This idea will be checked into by the trustees. Also a motion (Jeff/Ron) carried to use the money from the sale of the Colby quilt for the chairs.

Linda Martin suggested that we reinvent some of the activities that we have done in the past – collect an item each Sunday for a month (example: cereal one month, powdered milk one month, detergent one month, etc.—and distribute to some of the food pantries), perhaps have a salad sale after church and use the money for some special project, sub sandwich sale after church and use the money for a special project, etc.

Jericho House has many items stored in a building behind St. Andrews Church and (upon checking with Freda) Dave Koontz suggested that we offer to put some of the extra items in our yard sale and give the money to Jericho House as a way of providing additional assistance to Jericho House.

The possibility of an auction was discussed. Wayne will check on availability of our auctioneer.

The meeting was closed with prayer by Pastor Richie. Next meeting is February 4, 2014.
