#### ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL

The meeting was called to order by Ron Colby, and Wayne Kersey opened the meeting with a reading and prayer. Those present in addition to Wayne and Ron were Pastor Richie, Janet Pennington, Franki Noble, Dave Koontz, Bud Newbrough, Karen Ekstrom, Jason & Robin Black, Karen Kersey, Dave Ashley and Don & Marilyn Morton. Motion (Bud/Robin) carried to accept the February minutes as printed.

Treasurer's Report – Karen reported that there was some confusion with monies received from St. Luke and this has been corrected. We did not make an Apportionment payment this month. Motion (Bud/Don) carried to accept the February report as printed.

Finance – Finance Committee is recommending that any money in excess of \$1500 (the amount needed for the Building Fund payment) from the March yard sale be given to the trustees to be used for the two projects they are working on. Motion (Bud/Janet) carried that monies from the yard sale in March in excess of \$1500 be designated for the trustees to use for the new roof for the parsonage and removal of the trees at the parsonage.

Christian Education – A call has been issued for persons to help with Bible School this summer. Depending on the response, perhaps we would have a Friday/Saturday/Sunday Bible School. Pastor Richie is assisting in picking curriculum. Galactic Blast, Planet Zoom and Hero Headquarters are possibilities.

We are currently seeking a way for our young children to participate in a neighborhood event which would allow them to see the different economic stations of life.

The next two Sundays, we will be passing the basket for funds to buy candy for the Easter eggs that are used in the Easter Egg Hunt.

**Wellness** – The committee made \$249 on the baked potato luncheon on Sunday, and plans to add this money to the new table fund.

Family Ministries – The Religious Arts Festival is scheduled for Sunday, April 11<sup>th</sup>, 5:30 pm. There will be art work on display, a covered dish dinner (with everyone bringing their specialty), we will act out the parables (small groups with 10 minute prep time + limited props), and have some music with "Our Julie".....

For the Festival, plans are for people to create an original piece of art or to bring an object that you already own that has special religious significance to you, with a brief explanation.

For the Culinary Arts we will have Greek Cooking Class (with Chris Bennett who is from Greece) on March 22, and Dick Thompson will have a Smoker Cooking Class on April 9/10. Plans are to use the smoked meat for our dinner on the 11<sup>th</sup> and perhaps those from the Greek Cooking Class will make some Greek goodies to share at the dinner.

The on-line book study is underway with approx. 25 people participating. *the me I want to be* is the name of the book and if someone is interested, we will try to get a book and catch them up to speed.

There will be art classes for the kids – March 11, March 21 and April 8. Call Ekstroms if interested.

Bread & Company will now be on Thursdays, 5:45 pm starting this week – John Carr & Dick Thompson are still doing the cooking and encourage all to bring a friend and attend.

**Outreach** – Postcards will be mailed to the neighborhood regarding our Easter services.

Committee is handling the PR for the yard sale. And the Cantata will be presented April 7<sup>th</sup> with combined choirs from Dunbar Methodist and Lakeview and the committee is handling the PR for this.

**Nurture** – Plans are underway for the Easter Sunrise Breakfast.

**Parsonage** – A minor problem in one of the bathrooms has been brought to our attention, and will be repaired shortly.

**PS/PRC** – The committee met in February on routine matters. Committee will meet

again in April to begin the pastor evaluation process pending instructions from the district.

Trustees - The fire extinguishers at the church need to be checked and a professional has been recommended for the job. This would be at a cost of \$100. Motion (Dave K./Dave A.) carried that we have the extinguishers checked.

Our furnace room has become overstocked with many items from persons working at the church, using an item and then leaving the item in the furnace room. Motion (Dave K./Bud) carried that we will bring all items out of the furnace room, have trustees check to see if items need to be kept and the remainder will be sold at the yard sale.

sycamore The trees in the parsonage yard have become overgrown and need to be removed. A quote has been obtained (\$350 for each tree) to fell Motion (Dave K./Dave A.) the trees. carried that we proceed with this option. This will only be to take the trees to the ground, St. Albans will bring their chipper to take some of the small branches, a neighbor has agreed to take the larger limbs, there will be a need for some chain saws and manpower once the trees are felled, and some of the wood will be available for church members if interested.
