After reviewing the minutes, a motion (Bud/Don M.) carried to accept the October minutes as printed.

Treasurer's Report – Motion (Bud/Don M.) carried to accept the October report. All bills were paid and monies were sent toward our Conference Apportionment; however, we are still one month behind.

**Finance -** The 2012 budget was presented, and a motion (Don M./Dave K.) carried to accept it.

Fiftieth Anniversary Celebration – Thanks to all those who made our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration a success. We had very good meals, good services and good participation. We were able to do many outreach projects through the year and have two remaining – coats in November and blankets/sheets in December.

Christian Education – Currently working with Family Ministries to do a play on December 11.

**Family Ministries** – A CPR class is scheduled for November 18<sup>th</sup> at Lakeview. Linda Martin is coordinating this endeavor and Steve Obermeyer will conduct the class.

Judy Belcher and Karen Ekstrom are working on the family dinner and children's program on December 11.

Outreach - Ron & Marilyn Colby are working on securing names from the St. Albans Ministerial Association for Christmas baskets. There was discussion regarding using only the Ministerial Association for

names, rather than securing names from several places, to eliminate someone getting multiple baskets while others may get none.

**Nurture** – The Thanksgiving Dinner is scheduled for November 20. Set up will be the evening before. A clipboard for food sign up is in the back of the sanctuary.

**PS/PRC** – Lakeview's PS/PRC met and has completed their evaluation/salary recommendations for the pastor and other church employees.

The committee will meet this Thursday, November 10, at 6 pm on other matters.

Trustees – We are still in the process of selling the extra lot (in conjunction with the fire department) and since the fire chief's wife is a realtor, she will list the property for us.

An estimated cost of \$8500 would be required to replace the boiler on the education wing of the church.

After some discussion regarding the rear door to the education wing, Dave will reconfigure the closing apparatus so that it will be easier for our people to go in and out, especially so the kids can use the playground equipment.

Dear Lakeview UMC congregation,

I would first like to compliment everyone on an extremely nice and well done 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration. Not only was it very well organized, planned, and executed, it was so relaxing and enjoyable Friday evening, I found myself looking forward to the entire week-end.

Having been a member of Lakeview nearly 50 years ago, I was very impressed with the improvements and additions you have made through the years and how you have maintained the buildings and the grounds.

The time I spent with you for the celebration was obviously bitter-sweet for me. I grew-up at Lakeview, I was president of the MYF at one point, and myself and 2 other youth, Carol Davis (Hamon) and Terry Martin were singled out during one of Dr. Culpepper's sermons for not paying attention. He actually stopped in the middle of his sermon to speak to us. Needless to say, it wasn't a very pleasant afternoon at the Baum residence, at least not for me.

As most of you found out during the week-end, my Mother's death was the first in the church. She was 58 and I was 18. I remember vividly how the church helped my family during this ordeal. I know we would have had an extremely difficult time had it not been for our church family, few of which are still attending Lakeview. Reverend Don Underwood assisted Dr. Culpepper with the funeral service and Bill Casto was one of the pallbearers.

Having spent the week-end renewing old acquaintances, meeting several of your members for the first time, and just recounting various events from the years I spent at Lakeview, I will remember the time spent with you for years to come. Looking back over the week-end I wouldn't have missed it for anything.

I am currently a member of South Parkersburg UMC and I have an absolutely wonderful church family. But after spending the week-end at the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration and the way each of you made me feel, in the years to come, if someone asks me if I have a church family, I am going to say I am extremely blessed because I have two. I certainly hope you don't mind.
